EMPOWERING LIVES WITH CARE

At Community Chest, we collaborate with like-minded partners to create platforms for our social service users to contribute through their talents and abilities. Through your gifts of time and resources, those in need of support are presented with opportunities to pursue their dreams and fulfil their potential.

Stiven Willi Sim, Movement for the Intellectually Disabled of Singapore (MINDS)

Children are inquisitive by nature and Stiven is no exception. However, he struggled with not being able to communicate his curiosity with others. At the age of 8, Stiven's persistent aversion to speaking up and trying new things was worrying. He was later diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). Stiven often shied away from attention, preferring to make requests by gesturing instead of speaking, and rejected doing tasks. To help Stiven realise his potential, he was enrolled into MINDS Lee Kong Chian Gardens School (LGS), a special education school supported by Community Chest. The programmes provided by LGS boosted his academic progress and enabled him to verbalise his requests and interact with his peers. On Stiven's journey of discovering the world, he has explored horse-riding with the Riding for the Disabled Association and now excels in it after overcoming his initial fear.



BUILDING A COLLABORATIVE AND IMPACTFUL ECOSYSTEM

In building an inclusive community, the people, public, and private sectors have joined hands to make a powerful difference. With the unwavering support of all our partners, Community Chest is able to serve the evolving social needs of our service users.

Mr Loh Wee Kiat, SPD

Born with cerebral palsy, Wee Kiat is not able to walk or run. However, disability is no obstacle to him in pursuing his aspirations. After his studies at the Cerebral Palsy Alliance Singapore, Wee Kiat was referred to the sheltered workshop at SPD, an organisation supported by Community Chest that serves persons with disabilities, to equip him with skills and improve his employability. With the support from the workshop, he found a good fit in computer-based work and often stepped forward to help fellow trainees with simple IT troubleshooting. Through the workshop, Wee Kiat overcame his fears of using a motorised wheelchair. With his

newfound independence, he looks forward to buying his meals and going on outings with his family and friends. The confidence that Wee Kiat has built up over time encourages him to take on new challenges. Once a person with low self-esteem, Wee Kiat now aspires to bring positive impact to people with disabilities by sharing his experiences. He is also working towards his goal of securing employment in an IT-related setting in the mainstream workforce.



STRENGTHENING OUR SOCIAL SERVICE ECOSYSTEM FOR THE FUTURE



While Community Chest continues to mobilise resources and donations for supported social service agencies (SSAs) and their critical programmes, it recognises that demand for social services is set to increase in both scale and complexity, especially post-COVID.

With limited resources, we need to optimise the donations raised by strengthening our SSAs. This will enable SSAs to strengthen their sustainability and create more impact in serving social service users.

This is what the Community Capability Trust (CCT) aims to do – to help SSAs build their capabilities and capacity, so that they are able to make use of resources more sustainably and deliver better service outcomes.

The Government and Tote Board have committed to contribute \$200 million to the

CCT's initial capital and a further \$150 million to match donations to the CCT in the coming years. Community Chest itself has committed \$30 million as capital. In the long run, we hope to affect a mindset shift – from a fundraising mindset with a focus on the 'now', to a philanthropic mindset that funds the sector for the long-term and sustainable growth.

We invite you, our valued partners and donors, to see the CCT as a way to complement traditional programme funding and create a legacy with your donation. With strategic partnerships by the people, private and public sectors catalysed by the CCT, we can ensure that the sector stays future-focused, resilient, and ready to meet future challenges.

This year, Extra•Ordinary People partners Community Chest at the Community Chest Awards 2021 to curate the event's tote bag. It features a painting by Genine Tham, a differently-abled artist and a beneficiary of their Art Psychotherapy Programme.

Extra•Ordinary People was established in July 2017 as a registered charity, with a mission to support every person with special needs in Singapore through community-supported initiatives. Through integrated therapy services, performing arts programmes, inclusive employment opportunities and caregiver support programmes, their vision is to create a more inclusive and Extra•Ordinary Singapore.



When Genine first started her Art Psychotherapy sessions in 2019, Genine was only able to draw the letter 'H' and the number '9' using a red marker. Within a therapeutic space through guidance and encouragement by her therapists, she has since developed a sense of openness, learning to playfully explore her environment through movement, rhythm, colour, sound and touch. Genine even articulated her first complete sentence, 'I want to choose' while pointing to her colour of choice during one of the sessions.

To date, Genine has had her paintings featured at two exhibitions, including a solo exhibition. Through this artistic journey, she has blossomed into a confident young woman who is able to make her own choices and navigate her way through this world.

APSN TANGLIN SCHOOL MULTIMEDIA CLUB



The Multi-Media Club (MMC), a CCA programme in APSN Tanglin School, is made up of about 60 students in Secondary 1 to 4. The students are passionate about technology and media and keen to pursue their interest in various specialised skills in technology domains such as digital content, 3D design and printing, drone navigation and coding, and games development.

MMC aims to empower students as active creators by enabling authentic opportunities for them to individually and collaboratively inquire, build, design and create. The club fosters skills and habits of mind that encourage creation of information, ideas, and products with real-world applications. It also gives the students opportunities to present and demonstrate their learning and solutions at various schools and public events such as the Singapore Maker Faire, SPED learning conferences and community festivals. The most significant highlight for the students is their attainment of the Maker of Merit award for presenting the most innovative project at the 2018 Maker Faire.

entertaining spectacle from start to finish as it depicts Singapore's resilience in its COVID-19 journey from pandemic to endemic.

Tanglin School celebrates the diversity and ability of students with special needs. By embracing this positive perspective and creating positive modifications in the design and delivery of instruction that build on students' strengths, they ensure that their students achieve success both in the classroom and out in the real world.

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Being a homegrown household name that has been well-supported by the local consumers over the generations, Lam Soon Singapore understood that they had an important responsibility towards the community when the pandemic kicked in.

In 2020, the homegrown Fast Moving Consumer Goods giant commemorated their 70th anniversary with a \$7 million pledge. This included a \$3.5 million donation to Community Chest, which was disbursed to support eight social service agencies that champion the needs of groups such as children with special needs, youth-at-risk, and adults with disabilities. This donation is the largest one-off contribution from a corporate donor towards Community Chest's funded programmes.

The donation is aimed at mitigating the impact of COVID-19 on those in need of assistance in Singapore, and Lam Soon Singapore saw how their generous support would be especially vital in this period of crisis. In addition, they partnered Edible Garden City to build sustainable gardens in schools and care facilities, to instil the concept of sustainability in the young and to empower the elderly through improved holistic wellness.

This gesture exemplified the organisation's desire to uphold their twin values of Community and Sustainability. Beyond philanthropy, Lam Soon Singapore endeavours to continue extending their support in areas of volunteerism with Community Chest, to inculcate the value of giving back among their 120 employees.

As a homegrown company, StarHub cares for the local community and channels support towards its key sustainability goals of narrowing the digital divide and improving connectivity and employability for people in need.

StarHub is a longstanding partner of Community Chest and was a key partner of Community Chest Heartstrings Walk 2021. The organisation raised and donated \$367,200 and rallied its employees to participate at the virtual fun walk.

About 50 percent of the donation was used to support programmes at Metta Welfare Association, SHINE Children and Youth Services and Singapore Anglican Community Services, empowering hundreds of children and youths, and helping persons with mental health conditions to reintegrate into the workforce.

The balance of the contribution was channeled to The Food Bank Singapore to support lower-income households and seniors with healthier food items available 24/7 through a network of vending machines. This initiative harnessed the power of technology to help those in need and was part of StarHub's multi-faceted efforts during the pandemic to help the community tide over the difficult period.

In addition to their annual donations towards Community Chest's funded programmes, StarHub donated \$300,000 to The Courage Fund last year to provide relief and support to frontline healthcare workers and COVID-19 patients. The organisation also helped close to 4,000 service users through the distribution of welfare care packs and the defrayment of HDB rental costs in collaboration with Care Corner Singapore, a social service agency supported by Community Chest.

At a time when individuals and families face unparalleled difficulties, StarHub reached out to lend their support, exemplifying their efforts in building a more connected and inclusive Singapore.



Our strong collaboration with Community Chest goes back to 2002. With StarHub at the forefront of digital technology and Community Chest in close walk with beneficiaries, we are gratified that we can join hearts and hands to care for those in need of support. It is heartening to see our joint efforts, from annual fundraisers to community events, enabling a myriad of worthy causes and helping to improve the quality of life among beneficiaries.

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SECRETARIAT of healthcare **PROFESSIONAL BOARDS**



























As healthcare Professional Boards (PBs) under the Ministry of Health, the Singapore Medical Council (SMC) and all the healthcare PBs place the wellbeing of the public at the core of their work. In 2020, the Secretariat of healthcare Professional Boards (SPB) was set up as a department under the SMC to provide common shared services to all the healthcare PBs in Singapore.

Realising that the COVID-19 pandemic had brought many challenges to individuals and families, SMC/SPB stepped up their efforts and inspire employees to give back to the community. They actively rally employees to contribute a portion of their monthly salary through the Community Chest SHARE programme to support social service agencies.

During staff orientation, all new employees are encouraged to sign up for the monthly giving programme via payroll. SMC/SPB also engages individual employees who have yet to come on board the Auto-Inclusion Scheme to give them a better understanding of SHARE and encourage them to sign up for it. Their efforts paid off as employee participation rate jumped to 93 percent, a 15 percent increase from the previous year.

SMC/SPB's employees also participated in various CSR fundraising efforts. These include donations



made to "Food from the Heart" to support lower-income families through its food distribution programme, and funds raised to bring 'Fu Dais' to seniors and families in need of support to spread festive cheer during the Lunar New Year.

SMC/SPB has remained steadfast in their support of Community Chest by making SHARE an integral part of its employees' giving journey. They hope these efforts will bring significant improvement to the lives of those in need.



The SMC/ SPB has always been very supportive of CSR efforts, as we believe in giving back to the society to help the less fortunate. SMC/SPB actively engages our staff to support the Community Chest SHARE Auto-Inclusion Scheme and various meaningful fundraising activities. We will continue to play our part in supporting corporate social initiatives to help those in need, especially during this challenging period.

As an education institution, Republic Polytechnic promotes the ethos of empathy and compassion among their staff and students. To create a seamless donation process for employees, they started the SHARE Auto-Inclusion Scheme (AIS) in 2014 for all new hires to donate monthly on a voluntary basis. Over time, more colleagues joined the Scheme, enabling them to achieve an overall participation rate of 74 percent every vear.

When the pandemic turned into a year of unprecedented events in 2020, Republic Polytechnic saw a need to do more to support those who were affected socially and financially. They extended the AIS to all full-time staff who were yet to be on board by helping them understand the impact of their contribution. In 2020, participation rate increased to 99 percent.

Besides donations to SHARE, Republic Polytechnic actively promotes activities organised by Community Chest to their school community and partners Community Chest through their student service-learning projects.

Republic Polytechnic resonates deeply with the work of Community Chest in their goals to empower and uplift others, whether through

For the past 13 years, CapitaLand has been in strong support of Community Chest. Caring for and giving back to the community is prevalent in its company culture, where they actively encourage volunteerism among staff and senior leaders.

FairPrice Group has been supporting seniors in various ways. When restrictions due to the pandemic kicked in, they recognised that seniors are at a higher risk of social isolation. As large group volunteering activities came to a halt, FairPrice volunteers found creative ways to continue reaching out to seniors residing in nursing homes.

With the help of technology, staff volunteers filmed and produced activity videos and virtual shopping tours to keep Ren Ci Nursing Home residents engaged. Similarly, for residents of NTUC Health Nursing Home, they conducted virtual exercises and put together a music video over Zoom during National Day to rouse national pride. At Bishan Home for the Intellectually Disabled, staff volunteers took to Zoom to conduct origami sessions to engage with residents in a fun and interactive way.

In addition, FairPrice Group supported The Food Bank Singapore and Food from the Heart in their food distribution programmes which served 300,000 individuals and 28 welfare homes respectively. Through in-store donation drives, they raised over \$67,000 worth of grocery donations for beneficiaries of both charities.

FairPrice Group has cultivated a strong sense of social responsibility among employees and their strong support has brought significant impact and meaning to many lives.



FairPrice Group embraces the practice of corporate philanthropy to empower and build resilience in our community. PINNACLE AWARD

The Pinnacle Award is the highest honour conferred by Community Chest to recognise and thank an organisation for its exemplary efforts in holistic caring and the excellent example it sets as a role model in the following three aspects:

1

GIVING OF DONATIONS

2

VOLUNTEERISM AND/OR MAKING NON-MONETARY CONTRIBUTIONS 3

INCLUSIVE EMPLOYMENT

The nominee organisation must be eligible for firstly, a SHARE Award or Charity Award and secondly, a Volunteer Partner or Enabler Award. Besides the presentation of the Pinnacle Award to showcase an organisation that leads the wave in the giving of its time and treasures, the organisation must also incorporate sustainable and inclusive employment measures such as:

1

Number of persons with disabilities or mental health conditions hired (based on a percentage of total staff strength). 2

Policies or practices implemented to facilitate the seamless hiring and integration of these staff.

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Procurement of products or services provided by charities or social enterprises.

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SGX Cares is the collective name for Singapore Exchange's (SGX) three CSR pillars:

- Bull Charge, SGX's flagship fundraising initiative which includes their popular Charity Run held annually since 2004.
- 2) Outreach, an initiative for SGX's staff to volunteer through activities like delivering care packages to individuals and families needing support and sprucing up transitional shelter homes.
- 3) Initiatives to foster financial literacy.



To prioritise the health and safety of participants, the Bull Charge Charity Run was converted to a virtual format last year, enabling runners to join in from different cities around the world for the first time. Despite being a challenging year globally for charitable fundraising, SGX was able to rally the support of the financial community to successfully raise over \$3.6 million. Working alongside Community Chest, the funds were channelled to AWWA Ltd., Autism Association (Singapore), Fei Yue Community Services, HCSA Community Services and Shared Services for Charities.

Through last year's Charity Run, SGX also matched contributions dollar-for-dollar to \$1.5 million while committing an additional 1,000 volunteer hours. More than 200 staff volunteers contributed 1,385 volunteering hours over nine different activities through the year, altogether touching the lives of more than 2,400 individuals.

Since the COVID-19 outbreak, SGX has made significant contributions to provide support and relief measures. In March 2020, they rolled out a \$5 million SGX Care Package, including a \$1.5 million contribution to national healthcare-support programmes such as The Courage Fund facilitated

by Community Chest. Their support has made an indelible impact during this challenging time.

This year, SGX continues to partner Community Chest to raise funds for social service agencies and their service users through a variety of fundraising initiatives such as the Bull Charge Charity Run. SGX is confident that SGX Cares' beneficiaries can continue to count on their international community of corporate partners and staff volunteers to exemplify the spirit of "Better Happens Together".



Through SGX Cares, we create positive social impact by activating the power of community. By collaborating with different stakeholders, we can find new ways to extend a helping hand and build relationships that sustain, through the good times and the tough ones. When we rally with a shared vision and purpose, Better Happens Together.

The Community Chest Awards 2021 Sub-Committee oversees the administration of the Awards and ensures that the selection of the award recipients is in line with the spirit and purpose of the Awards.

Mr Robert Chew, PBM, BBM, Chairman

Mr Robert Chew is a Partner at Stream Global and iGlobe Partners, a technology incubator and venture capital firm respectively. He serves on the boards of tech companies - Assurity (Chairman), CloudSine, SourceSage and StaffOnDemand, and was previously a partner in Accenture. He has received numerous awards for his contributions to the industry, such as the IT Leader of the Year from the Singapore Computer Award and the Distinguished Partner Awards from SPRING Singapore.

Mr Chew serves on the boards of various organisations – Health Sciences Authority, Kwong Wai Shiu Hospital, Shared Services for Charities and National Council of Social Service. He is also a member of the boards of the Singapore University of Technology and Design (SUTD), Singapore Mediation Centre (SMC) and chairs the Singapore Standards Council (SSC, Enterprise Singapore).

For his contributions to the community, Mr Chew was conferred the Public Service Medal in 2013 and Public Service Star in 2017. Mr Chew has been serving with Community Chest since 2014.

Mr Andrew da Roza, Member

Mr Andrew da Roza is a psychotherapist, assisting private clients and their families with addictions. Mr da Roza is also a representative of Community Chest on the NCSS Services Committee, and a Mental Health Adviser to the Committee. Mr da Roza was a lawyer for over 25 years, first in private practice with UK law firms Linklaters and Lovells; and then as General Legal Counsel for FedEx Asia Pacific and subsequently General Counsel of International SOS. He has Masters degrees in law; counselling; and addictions science; and an MBA from Kellogg-HKUST. 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AWARDS CRITERIA AND ELIGIBILITY

Selection of the award recipients is based on contributions made in the preceding financial year, starting 1 April and ending 31 March. This year, the nomination period for the Volunteer Partner Award, Enabler Award and Pinnacle Award was opened from 26 April to 21 May 2021. An eligible organisation may be nominated by a third party with the consent of the organisation. Self-nominations were also accepted.

SHARE Award

The SHARE Awards recognise organisations with employees on SHARE for their high participation rate. The organisation must have made a minimum annual contribution of \$5,000 and has contributed regularly for at least nine months within the assessment period, but not necessarily for consecutive months.

The various types of SHARE Awards are:

Charity Award

The Charity Awards are presented to organisations and individuals who have made significant donations to Community Chest. These donations include outright donations, funds raised from events and contributions through SHARE, Community Chest's monthly giving programme.

The various types of Charity Awards are:

Volunteer Partner Award

The Volunteer Partner Award serves to recognise exemplary organisation(s) for their regular volunteerism efforts in service-based, skills-based and/ or event-based volunteerism, with demonstrated outcomes to benefit social service agencies and/ or service users.

The nominee must have volunteered with a charity that is a member of the National Council of Social Service, and the charity must be supportive of the nomination. The nominee must have displayed sustained commitment to the social service agency and supported its staff to volunteer regularly, and significantly contributed to strengthening the capabilities of the social service agency or quality of life of service users.

Enabler Award

The Enabler Award serves to recognise organisations and individuals who have offered their talents and/or resources to benefit the social service sector through Community Chest initiatives. The contribution towards addressing social needs can be made by the nominee in ways like:

- i. Talent, capability and network including but not limited to the following:
- ★ Offering media assets and resources such as digital/social media/advertising platforms (e.g. print ads, broadcast ads, out-of-home ads etc.)
- ★ Mobilising and connecting people/organisations/partners to support Community Chest in Signature Events, special fundraising projects, etc.

Pinnacle Award

The Pinnacle Award is the highest honour conferred by Community Chest to recognise and thank an organisation for its exemplary efforts in holistic caring and the excellent example it sets as a role model in the following three aspects:

- i. Giving of donations
- ii. Volunteering and/or making non-monetary contributions
- iii. Embracing inclusive employment practices

The nominee must be eligible for a SHARE Award or Charity Award, and a Volunteer Partner Award or Enabler Award. The organisation must also incorporate sustainable and inclusive employment practices and measures such as:

- i. Hiring of persons with disabilities or mental health conditions
- ii. Policies or practices implemented to facilitate the hiring and integration of these staff
- iii. Procurement of products or services provided by social service agencies or social enterprises

The Community Chest Awards recognises people and organisations as the stars of caring and sharing. The logo design consists of a star made up of people and organisations raising their hands together, working hand in hand to help people in need of support.

The refreshed logo also takes inspiration from the Community Chest logo. The head and open arms, which is derived from the Community Chest logo, represents continuity and showcases how each individual has a part to play in social service.

The five points of the star represent the five categories of awards and recognise the winners as stars in their own rights.

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
